

COVID-19 Prevention Strategies
Updated on 09/01/2021

Contact Tracing will be completed and submitted to Wayne COUNTY Health Department (WCHD)

All staff and visitors will be required to complete a daily health screening prior to entering the building

Mask Guidance: We will follow the WCHD mandates for all things COVID related. Inside - masks will be worn by all, outside - masks are optional, visitors - must wear masks at all times

Athletics: we will follow both the WCHD and the Michigan High School Athletic Associations for school sports. This may mean that masks are worn during practices and athletic events. <https://www.mhsaa.com/>

Lunch Procedures: All students will eat in the cafeteria with half of the cafeteria being used while the other half is cleaned. We now have more lunch times to accommodate half the classes eating lunch in the cafeteria.

Cohorting Procedures: Students will be in their main classroom for the majority of the day, but may share teachers with other students for subjects like science and social studies. Middle School students will share Specials Teachers for their classrooms

Social Distancing Protocol: Following the WCHD recommendations, we will work to keep students at least three feet apart.

Handwashing: Handwashing will be mandatory before lunch and students will be encouraged to do this throughout the day, especially after using shared materials or spaces.

Cleaning and Disinfection: Classes and shared spaces are cleaned multiple times a day. The whole building goes through a thorough cleaning daily at the beginning and end of each day when students are not in the building.

Improved Ventilation: We have individual air handlers in the majority of our classrooms. Each one has an up to date air cleaner installed last year.

Visitor Restrictions: Visitors are restricted to the main office and must wear face masks at all times while in the building. They must also complete a health check before entering the school.

We ask that you please keep your student(s) home if they are experiencing COVID related symptoms. They may return when symptoms are gone or a negative covid test is presented.
